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## 1. General Information

### 1.1. Programme Title

Minor Programme in Global China Studies  
全球中国研究副修

### 1.2. Academic Unit Involved in the Delivery of the Programme

The Programme is to be jointly managed by Chinese Culture and Global Communication Programme (CCGC) and Centre of Foreign Languages and Cultures (CFLC).

### 1.3. Programme Aims, Objectives, and Intended Learning Outcomes

The aim of this Minor Programme is twofold. First it provides students with basic language skills to understand how China is depicted in different contexts and different places. For international students, they will learn basic Chinese to find out the diverse perceptions of “China” within China and in the rest of the world. For domestic students, they will learn a foreign language (e.g., French, German, Spanish, Japanese and Korean) to find out how China is seen abroad and how that image differs from what they think of as China.

Second, this Minor Programme teaches students a method to appreciate the creativity and ingenuity in cross-cultural exchanges. Grounded in language skills, comparative cultural studies, and an openness to differences, this method help students to be broad-minded and creative in our 21st century globalized world.

Since languages, inter-cultural communication and the openness to differences are skills highly valued in today’s national and international labour market, the primary objective of this Minor Programme is to increase students’ marketability by strengthening their portfolios for work placement and graduate school applications.

#### **1.4. Medium of Instruction**

The Minor Programme in Global China Studies is to be offered from the Academic Year of 2022-2023.

### **2. Programme Requirements and Structure**

#### **2.1. Programme Requirements**

Students can claim the Minor Programme in Global China Studies if they can fulfil the following criteria:

- a) Complete 15 units in accordance with the stipulated programme structure; and
- b) Attain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 for all the courses.

#### **2.2. Programme Structure**
