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### 1. General Information

### 1.1. Programme Title

Minor Programme in Journalism and Media Studies 新闻媒体副修

### 1.2. Academic Unit Involved in the Delivery of the Programme

The Minor Programme is to be offered by the Media and Communication Studies (MCOM) Programme and administered under the Division of Humanities and Social Sciences (DHSS).

### 1.3. Programme Aims, Objectives, and Intended Learning Outcomes

The general aim of the Minor Programme is to provide students with a foundation in hands-on journalism skills and/or critical media literacy for the rapidly changing and highly interdisciplinary media industries globally. Specifically, the programme objectives are to provide students with:

- (1) English competence in journalism and/or media representations with a global purview.
- (2) Writing, reporting, and creative skills that be applied in various subfields of the media industry as producers and/or analysts.
- (3) A critical and sociological perspective in understanding modern media institutions, texts, and cultures.

### 1.4. Medium of Instruction

### 1.5. Target Students

The target students of the Programme are students of all majors except for those in International Journalism (IJ) and Media and Communication Studies (MCOM).

### 1.6. Year of Implementation

The Minor Programme in Journalism and Media Studies has been offered from the Academic Year of 2020-21.

### 2. Programme Requirements and Structure

### 2.1. Programme Requirements

Students can claim the Minor Programme in Journalism and Media Studies if they can fulfil the following criteria:

- a) Complete 15 units in accordance with the stipulated programme structure; and
- b) Attain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 for all the courses.

### 2.2. Programme Structure

Students of the Minor Programme in Journalism and Media Studies are required to complete one required courses and four elective courses as stipulated in the table below.

In particular, Minor applicants are encouraged to follow one focus in choosing Minor Required and Minor Electives on either category: I.) Media Studies; or II.) Journalism. However, to maximize the benefits for individual interests, the student can claim the Minor Programme as long as he/she finishes 3 required units and 12 elective units with a satisfying GPA regardless of the recommended logic.

Students are required to complete at least one course at level 3 or above.
