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1. General Information

1.1. Programme Title

Minor Programme in Social Planning and Social Innovation 社会规划与社会创新副修

1.2. Academic Unit Involved in the Delivery of the Programme

The Minor Programme is to be offered by the Social Work and Social Administration Programme (SWSA) and administered under the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences.

1.3. Programme Aims, Objectives, and Intended Learning Outcomes

The overall aims of this Minor Programme are twofold.

- (1) Firstly, the programme will educate students to become effective, efficient and caring social planners and social entrepreneurs who are responsible for analysing, formulating and implementing social innovation for the improvement of social well-being.
- (2) Secondly, the programme will educate students who are determined to become competent, innovative and ethical social entrepreneurs to turn social problems into opportunities. Students are also expected to develop informational literacy, critical thinking, problem solving skills and to uphold core social values.
