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## 1. General Information

### 1.1. Programme Title

Minor Programme in Social Planning and Social Innovation

### 1.2. Academic Unit Involved in the Delivery of the Programme

The Minor Programme is to be offered by the Social Work and Social Administration Programme (SWSA) and administered under the Division of Humanities and Social Sciences (DHSS).

### 1.3. Programme Aims, Objectives, and Intended Learning Outcomes

The overall aims of this Minor Programme are twofold.

- (1) Firstly, the programme will educate students to become effective, efficient and caring social planners and social entrepreneurs who are responsible for analysing, formulating and implementing social innovation for the improvement of social well-being.
- (2) Secondly, the programme will educate students who are determined to become competent, innovative and ethical social entrepreneurs to turn social problems into opportunities. Students are also expected to develop informational literacy, critical thinking, problem solving skills and to uphold core social values.

### **2.1. Programme Requirements**

- Complete 15 units in accordance with the stipulated programme structure; and
- Attain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 for all the course.

### **2.2. Programme Structure**

Students of the Minor Programme in Social Planning and Social Innovation are required to complete 4 required courses and 1 elective courses as stipulated in the table below, in which at least one course should be at level 3 or above.
