

Prof. Carlotta VITI



I am a linguist interested in both historical linguistics and general linguistics. I obtained a PhD in Linguistics at the University of Pisa (Italy, 2003) with a dissertation on Old Indian syntax, two post-docs in Linguistics (one at the University of Pisa, 2004-2006, and one at the Friedrich Schiller University of Jena, Germany, 2008-2010), and two Habilitations (one in Indo-European Studies at the University of Zurich, Switzerland, 2013, and one in General and Historical Linguistics at the École Pratique des Hautes Etudes of Paris, France, 2020). I had research and teaching appointments in different Universities of Europe and of Asia, especially in Italy, Germany, Switzerland, France, India, Singapore, Turkey, and China. My longest experience was at the University of Zurich, where I spent approximately ten years (teaching Latin and Greek linguistics), and where I obtained the qualification as Professor of Comparative Indo-European Linguistics in February 2019. I am currently a Professor of Linguistics in the Department of Classics of the University of Lorraine, France. My main research interests are based on comparative syntax and syntactic theory, comparative semantics and semantic theory, linguistic contact and multilingualism, as well as linguistic typology.
